Help Ensure Safety for All at Rivertown Dog Park

The Rivertown Dog Park is open for all dog owners and their pets to enjoy. Occasionally, a dog becomes aggressive with another dog or with a dog owner. Aggressive behavior is taken seriously to ensure the safety of all visitors. Any dog that shows aggressive or rough behavior must be leashed and removed from the park immediately. Owners are responsible for maintaining control of their dogs at all times and for preventing situations that could place people or

other animals at risk. When aggressive behavior occurs, park users are encouraged to prioritize safety, avoid confrontation and report the incident promptly.

When a dog poses a safety concern, incidents may be reported to law enforcement by calling 911 in an emergency or 651-322-2323 for non-emergency concerns. An officer may investigate and, if warranted, declare a dog potentially dangerous or dangerous based on



the circumstances. Dog owners are notified of any declaration and have the right to appeal. These procedures help ensure dangerous behavior is addressed fairly while keeping the dog park safe and enjoyable for the community.

Water Treatment Plant Construction Continues

Construction began in September on the Central Water Treatment Plant (WTP) located on North Frontage Road. This is the first of three water treatment plants that will remove PFAS “forever chemicals” from City drinking water. Each plant is expected to take about a year and a half to build. This summer, we plan to break ground on the Eastern WTP in the Industrial Park. Construction on the Western WTP will start next year, probably on property near SEAS Church. Construction of all three plants should be completed ahead of a spring 2029 deadline.

We’ve already secured \$23.5 million through several grants and partial access to the state’s East Metro 3M Settlement fund. It’s a lot of help, but still far short of the \$70 million price tag. We’re currently looking at a 159% increase in water rates between 2024 and 2028 to make up the difference – as you’ve seen with increases last year and this year.

We are seeking other funds to help reduce the local burden. In late January, the federal budget included a \$1.1 million earmark toward the Western WTP. The Eastern WTP has been ranked as “fundable” for an additional \$5 million in emerging contaminants grants. We have submitted requests for state bonding or other assistance and will be active in St. Paul during this legislative session. Environmental investigations continue, which may open additional funds through the state’s East Metro 3M Settlement fund – but these are a long and uncertain process. Streets Identified for Summer Road Improvements

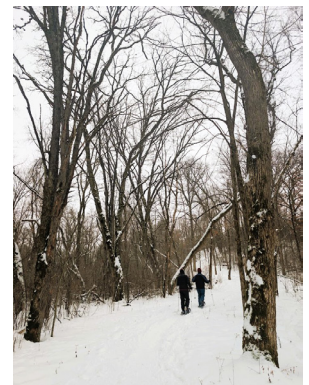
The 2026 Neighborhood Infrastructure Improvements project includes improvements along Pleasant Drive from Highway 55 to 4th St. W., and along 4th St. W. between Pleasant Drive and River St. The scope of work currently includes a full reconstruction of the street and underground utilities for a majority of these segments. In addition to the street and utility work, a new multi-use trail is planned to replace the existing sidewalk along the west side of Pleasant Drive between 4th St. and Highway 55. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

A Year of Growth, Investment and Planning for the Future

Last year was a busy year for development across the city. The city's Community Development Department has issued its 2025 annual report. The department supports land use planning, zoning, economic development, redevelopment, historic preservation, building inspection and code enforcement, while assisting the City Council, Planning Commission, HEDRA and advisory commissions.

Highlights include:

Housing

The city approved 42 new residential units totaling \$9.7 million in valuation. Key projects included Heritage Ridge, Vermillion Acres senior housing, Villas at Pleasant, South Oaks of Hastings, and Suite Living assisted living and memory care.

Commercial & Industrial

The city approved 55 commercial and industrial permits totaling \$12.9 million. Major projects included a new Chase Bank branch, the Central

Water Treatment Plant PFAS facility, United Heroes League Stadium improvements, Rio Gran Trucking and Storage Werk's.

Supporting the Community

The city undertook the following:

- Awarded nearly \$24,000 in Façade Improvement Grants, leveraging over \$104,000 in private investment.
- Partnered with Music in the Park for 12 Music + Market events, drawing more than 6,500 attendees.
- Launched a new Arts Event Grant Program and provided free business mentoring through Open to Business.
- Completed the Highway 55 Small Area Plan.

Planning Ahead

Planning efforts continued for major future projects, including Walden at Hastings, Block 28 Gateway, downtown redevelopment at Block 16, Vermillion Street (Hwy 61)

reconstruction, a comprehensive Zoning Code update and the Pleasant Valley Farm development.

RECYCLING, REUSE, REPAIR & DISPOSAL

Stay Safe with the Recycling Zone

Instead of leaving unwanted household items like yard and garden chemicals, cleaners, auto products, electronics around your house or garage, take them to the Recycling Zone in Eagan instead.

The Recycling Zone makes sure the stuff that doesn't belong in the trash or recycling is disposed of the right way to keep our environment safe.

Dropping off is easy. You stay in your car while staff unload materials from the trunk or backseat. Put smaller items in a box that you can leave behind.

Accepted items – free drop-off unless noted

- Auto products like motor oil, antifreeze and gas
- Batteries
- Bug killers/repellents
- Cardboard (no larger than 36" x 36")
- Cleaners

- Electronics (fee for TVs and computer monitors)
- Lightbulbs – all types
- Needles and sharps (in a closed rigid container, keep in front seat)
- Paints and stains
- Personal care products like nail polish and hair dye
- Propane tanks and aerosol sprays
- Scrap metal
- Tires (fee)
- Small household electronics like toasters and vacuums
- String lights and cords
- Vaping devices
- Weed killer
- Most products that say caution, warning, danger or poison



If you have an unknown or unique household chemical, email recyclingzone@co.dakota.mn.us prior to dropping off to work with Recycling Zone staff about safe handling.

Mattress/Box Spring Drop Off & Document Shred Event

Mark your calendars for our Mattress/Box Spring Drop-Off & Document Shred Event!

Drop off your old mattresses and box springs for \$30 per piece (payable directly to Certified Recycling; pricing subject to change). Mattresses in good condition will be donated to Bridging, while all others will be deconstructed and recycled by Certified Recycling.

Document shredding is free and will be handled on-site by a National Association for Information Destruction (NAID)-certified company. After shredding, paper

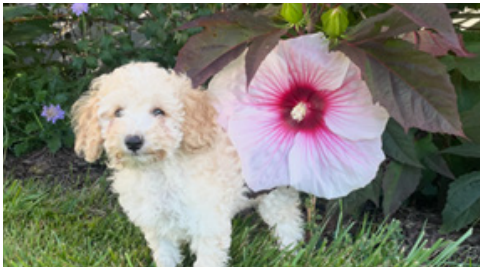

Reminders
